Reconciliation forms the basis for this sculpture. The granite table represents the historic division of the people of Ireland. It is supported by columns representing the four provinces. The inset sword spans both sides of the divide. This divide is bridged, at each end by bronze hand-clasps, that unify

both parts. Six granite seats represent the baronies of County Sligo.

All are organised within the circle, symbolising Life-Community-Freedom.

The standing stone symbolises our alignment to the past.

The trees in the grass island symbolise the growth of our Nationhood.
