The window above is the memorial to 21 members of the Church of Ireland Parish of Kinsale who died in the First World War, and whose names are listed on each side of the window.

Although the dates of the war are 1914 to 1918, some died later of wounds and hence we find the date 1919*.

The picture depicts the Risen Christ blessing two Roman soldiers of his own day.
