Seán Heuston

Born in Dublin in 1891.

Employed by the G. S. & W. R., 1908,
posted to Limerick. Transferred
to Kingsbridge in 1913.
He toiled hard in Fianna Éireann
in Limerick and in Dublin.

They immediately made him a train conductor
in the place where he founded Óglaigh na hÉireann
in November, 1913. He was Captain of Company
D in the First Battalion, 1914.

Easter Monday, 1916, he took possession of the
Mendicity Institute, Ussher Island.
With twenty men he restrained the forces
of the British Army who were trying to reach the city. He died
in Kilmainham, May, 1916.
