ASHLEY, MAURICE. Rank, Lieutenant, Royal Irish Fusiliers, 1st Batt; killed in action, Marcoing, near Cambrai, November 23, 1917; born Essex (Irish parents); age 20.

BALL, WILLIAM ORMSBY WYND-Rank, Lieutenant, Royal Army Medical Corps; killed in action by a shell, Soupier, France, September 26, 1914; age 24.



CRAIG, HEDLEY W. Rank, 2nd Lieutenant, Royal Engineers; killed in action, Mesopotamia, April 15, 1917; born Ireland; age 27.



CAMPBELL, PHILIP SIDNEY. Rank, Lieutenant Commander, Royal Naval Division; killed in action, Beaumont Hamel, November 13, 1916; age 23. Mentioned in Despatches.



DILWORTH, ROBERT KILDAHL. Rank, and Lieutenant, Royal Munster Fusiliers, 2nd Batt.; killed in action, December 28, 1916.



DOBBS, GEORGE ERIC BURROUGHS. Rank, Captain, (Brev-Major and Lieutenant-Colonel) Royal Engineers; died of wounds received same day, near Poperinghe, June 17, 1917; born Coolbawn, Castlecomer; age 32; decorations, Chevalier of the Legion of Honour; Mentioned in Despatches.




DUGGAN, GEORGE GRANT. Rank, Captain (Temporary), Royal Irish Fusiliers, 5th Batt.; died of wounds, Dardanelles, August 16, 1915.

FAUSSET, R. C. Rank, Lieutenant. Royal Field Artillery; died, wounds received in action, November 17, 1916; age 25.




HATTE, EDWARD STOKES. Rank, and Lieutenant (Temporary), Royal Irish Rifles, 7th Batt.; killed in action, August 16, 1917.



HENSLER, CYRIL GORDON. Canadian Infantry (Signal Section); killed in action, September 25, 1916; age 26.



HOMAN, ARTHUR DOUGLAS. Rank, Captain (Acting Major), Royal Irish Regiment, attached 7th Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry); died of wounds, May 9, 1917.





MANSFIELD, HAROLD BARTON. Rank, 2nd Lieutenant (Temporary), Royal Dublin Fusiliers, 10th Batt.; killed in action, November 13, 1916.




MAUNSELL, GEORGE WYNDHAM. Rank, 2nd Lieutenant, Queen Victoria's Own Sappers and Miners; killed in action, Tigris, February 23, 1917.



NIVEN, JAMES DOUGLAS. Rank. Engineer Lieutenant Commander, H.M.S. "Black Prince"; killed in action, off coast of Jutland, May 31, 1916; age, 33.



POTTER. HENRY WILLIAM ROSS. Rank, Major, 129th Baluchis, Indian Army; killed in action, Givenchy, North France, December 20, 1914; born India; age 43; decorations, Medal with two clasps North West Frontier of India, Mentioned in Despatches, Mons Star.



SCOTT, NOEL EDMUND. Rank, Lieutenant, Royal Engineers; shot by sniper, near Ypres, September 21, 1917; born Monasterevan, Co. Kildare; age 24; Mentioned in Despatches.



NEVILLE. THOMAS VILLIERS TUT-HILL THACKER. Rank, Captain, 3rd Dragoon Guards; killed in action, near Ypres, May 13, 1915.
