GLENBEVAN CO. LIMERICK. SERVED IN FRANCE FROM AUGUST 1914 EGYPT
DARFUR PALESTINE. MENTIONED TWICE IN DESPATCHES. DIED FROM AN
AEROPLANE ACCIDENT SEP 11 1917 AGED 26. RESTS AT N. CERNY.**
