Éire, the personification of Ireland and Cúchallainn, the hero of the Táin

Turlough, son of Brian Ború, fights the Vikings in 1014

Patrick Sarsfield's defence of Limerick against King William II, and the siege of Athlone

Red Hugh O'Donnell being lured aboard the ship which brought him to Dublin, and his subsequent escape.

Lord Edward Fitzgerald arrested and shot by Major Sirr in 1798, and Theobald Wolfe Tone, founder of the United Irishmen.

Robert Emmet in the uniform of the United Irishmen, and the 1798 pikemen's victory at New Ross. Also, Kevin Barry's head surrounded by flame, symbolising his martyrdom for Irish freedom.

The Easter Rising, 1916. Pearse and the Volunteer leaders at the G.P.O. James Connolly, wounded, is tended by a nurse. Inset above are the executed signatories of the 1916 Proclamation: Thomas Clarke, Seán MacDiarmada, Patrick Pearse, James Connolly, Thomas McDonagh, Éamonn Ceannt and Joseph Plunket.
